



Fundraiser & Auction Programs for Tax-Exempt Groups



Note: You must provide Federal Tax Exempt Certificate and written proof of event on organization letterhead. Procurement forms and letters accepted as proof.

Piece Price: 50% off retail price* *(Discount applies to piece price and studio fees when painted in the studio. No other discounts apply. See p.2 for information about completing items off-site.)*

Profit Example:

Platter-	Originally \$60 (includes studio fee)
With discount-	Cost= \$35
Minimum Bid-	\$40
Estimated final bid-	\$80-\$100 or more
Profit based on estimate above-	\$45 or more!

***NEW OPTION:** Change the discount rate to 30% off of the retail piece price and pay the full studio fee (1/2 the original price) and The Pottery Stop & Coffee Shop will turn the fingerprints into designs and add the text for you. This is a great option for groups who don't have a seasoned painter available to put the finished touches on the piece.

Where do you create the piece and will you have help??

Management can help you come up with a great design and teach you how to get a good print. Then simply take the piece and up to 5 colors to your location to get the fingerprints, handprints, etc. Bring the piece back to add the finishing touches in the studio using the full array of colors we offer as well as our design tools, brushes, etc. *Note* the new option above to have The Pottery Stop finish it for you. If you would prefer to do the painting and/or firing off-site, please see the pricing options on page two. Also, note the information on turn-around time on page two. Thanks!

Ideas for Your Event:

- Flower pots- Once fired, plant them with flowers/herbs to make it look even better!
- Salad bowl & plate set- fill with Easter Grass and salad dressings, tongs, etc.
- Cake plate- Include a gift certificate to a local bakery.
- Picture frame (works best with smaller groups) w/ a group photo
- Mug set packaged with cocoa/teas/coffees
- Popcorn/snacks bowl filled with yummy treats, movie rental coupons, etc.
- Trace your organization's logo, crest, or mascot. We'll show you how!

Turnaround time: We would appreciate a minimum of 2 weeks to complete your piece once you return it to us for glazing & firing. During November and December, we may need more than 2 weeks if you have multiple and/or large items. Thanks!

Port-a-Pottery Pricing for Fundraiser Items

At the studio, the studio fee that covers the cost of materials and firing is regularly 50% of the price of the piece. Thus, the materials charge is 25% of the piece price, and the firing fee is 25% of the piece price. In our "Port-a-Pottery" program, customers purchase their own bottles of color from The Pottery Stop to paint their items at home, and then pay only the 25% firing fee rather than the full studio fee. Pieces can be painted off-site if you prefer. This option is most cost-effective for organizations or individuals who plan on painting multiple items and for doing a Wall of Support.

If you paint at home, you **MUST** order all colors from The Pottery Stop if we are to fire the pieces in our kilns, and special care must be taken to ensure that non-fired products such as acrylic paints, etc., are not used on the pieces. Special pricing for tax-exempt groups doing fundraiser pieces using our "Port-a-Pottery" program is below.

- Piece Prices: 50% off
- Firing Fee: 25% of the price of the discounted price.
- Glaze (Colors):
 - 2 oz. colors \$2 8 oz. colors \$8 Pints \$16
 - Accents (dimensional glazes) Bottles (Red, White, Black) \$5 each
 - Glaze Pencils :\$10 each

Some organizations are able to fire their items off-site. In this instance, there would be no firing fee. This also allows the organization to control the turnaround time for their items. If you are firing off-site and wish to use your own glazes (color), be advised that all of our bisque (pottery) is fired to Cone 04. **NOTE:** You may only use glazes (color) purchased through The Pottery Stop if we will be firing your pieces in our kilns.
